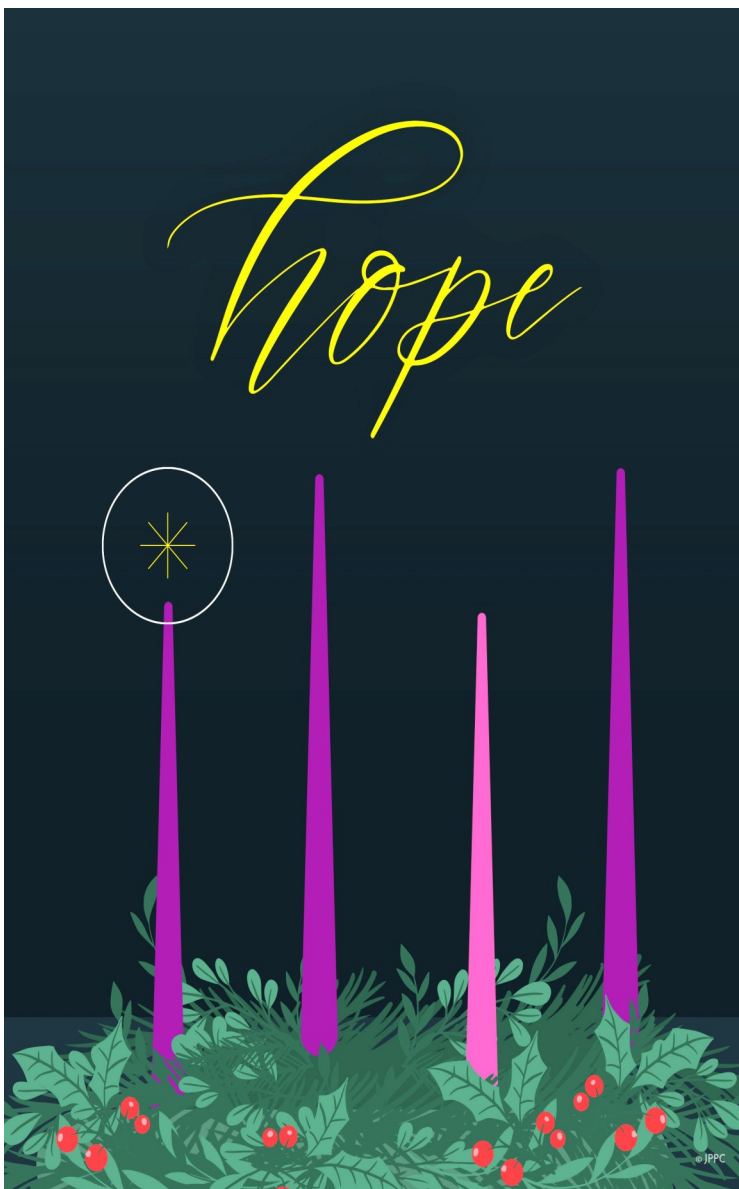

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent. "Stay awake (Matthew 24: 42)!" The Gospel for this First Sunday of Advent compels us to be alert and ready for the coming of the Lord during the whole time of Advent. As the Lord came in history and will come at the end of time, so he comes to us anew with the celebration of his Birth at Christmas. As Christians, we have the duty to prepare for this Birth and not simply to anticipate it. Let us resolve that this Advent will be a time of focused prayer in preparation for the Nativity. Pray with the prophet Isaiah, who prepared Israel for the Savior; pray with Mary who bore the Savior in her womb. Prepare with a good sacramental Confession. Advent passes so quickly, so we must stay awake! We must prepare well!

The Annual Forty Hours Devotion takes place this Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, the first three days of Advent. Please see elsewhere in this edition of the parish bulletin more information about the schedule for the Forty Hours Devotion. This Devotion gives us the opportunity to pause, to reflect and to pray. We pause from the busyness of our lives and spend time with our Lord truly present to us in his Holy Body and Blood. We reflect on the gift without equal from Almighty God, the Holy Eucharist—the saving Sacrifice of his Son—that brings us the constant graces of redemption. We pray—we adore the Lord—to praise him and to unite ourselves with him as we live our daily Christian lives. *Please join us for the Forty Hours Devotion!*

Thank you to all who have taken a star or several from the Advent Giving Trees in the Cathedral Basilica. A few stars remain. The Advent Giving Tree is a splendid expression of our duty as Christians to reach out to the poor and needy all the time, but especially as we prepare to commemorate the Birth of Jesus who shares his divinity with our humanity. This marvelous exchange impels us to recognize the Christ then in each person so deserving of our attentive care. Please return your Advent Tree gifts to the Sacristy by December 7, 2025.

On Monday, December 1, 2025, all the priests of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia—Diocesan and Religious Priests—will participate in the annual Day of Sanctification for Priests. The priests will gather with the Archbishop at Mother of Divine Providence Parish, King of Prussia, for a day of prayer and reflection. Please keep our priests in prayer for this occasion, especially for their holiness of life and zeal in the service of the Church.

Look for the Schedule of Confessions and Masses for Christmas and New Year's Day in the mail.

This is the last Sunday of November, the Month of the Holy Souls. Let us remember especially during Mass and in our prayers at home all the Holy Souls in Purgatory. May they soon know the full glory of God in Heaven.

Next Sunday, the Parish Calendars will be distributed for 2026. You are welcome to take an extra calendar for anyone you know who is homebound in your neighborhood.

Thank you to all our parishioners and visitors for your goodness and generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the national collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious. Estimados feligreses,

Este domingo es el primer domingo de Adviento. “¡Estén preparados! (Mateo 24:42)”. El evangelio de este primer domingo de Adviento nos exhorta a estar alertas y preparados para la venida del Señor durante todo el tiempo de Adviento. Así como el Señor vino en la historia y vendrá al final de los tiempos, así también viene a nosotros de nuevo con la celebración de su Nacimiento en Navidad. Como cristianos, tenemos el deber de prepararnos para este Nacimiento y no solo de anticiparlo. Resolvamos que este Adviento sea un tiempo de oración intensa en preparación para la Natividad. Oremos con el profeta Isaías, que preparó a Israel para el Salvador; oremos con María, que llevó al Salvador en su vientre. Preparémonos con una buena confesión sacramental. El Adviento pasa tan rápido, ¡así que debemos estar preparados! ¡Debemos prepararnos bien!

La Devoción Anual de las Cuarenta Horas se lleva a cabo este domingo, lunes y martes, los tres primeros días de Adviento. ADVENT REFLECTION 1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Welcome to Advent! And Happy New Year! Today, on the First Sunday of Advent, the Church begins her preparations for the celebration of our Lord's Nativity on December 25th. This is also the first day of the Church's liturgical calendar, the start of a new liturgical year. As we journey together through the four weeks of Advent, I want to reflect on our preparation for the birth of Christ with the aid of some of the saints we encounter during this holy season.

On this First Sunday of Advent, I want to reflect on the witness of St. Andrew. Today is November 30, which is typically the feast day of St. Andrew (although this year the Advent Sunday takes precedence). St. Andrew was one of the Twelve Apostles; in fact, he was the brother of Simon Peter. One of the interesting things about St. Andrew in the Gospels is that we always see him bringing people to Jesus. St. Andrew was originally a disciple of St. John the Baptist. After the Baptist proclaimed Jesus as the Lamb of God, St. Andrew went to get his brother and brought St. Peter to Jesus.

This practice continues throughout our Lord's public ministry. Later in John's Gospel, we learn that St. Andrew is the one who brings to Jesus the boy with the five loaves and two fish. Jesus will, of course, miraculously multiply those loaves and fish to feed the five thousand. Finally, after Jesus enters Jerusalem for the final time on Palm Sunday, some Greeks who want to see Jesus are taken to Him by St. Andrew.

Through our baptism, we are all called, like St. Andrew, to bring people to Jesus. There is no better time to do this than now, in the Advent and Christmas seasons. The sight of our tiny King sleeping in a manger has a way of awakening in people an otherwise dormant sense of religiosity. Invite people to come to Mass with you, throughout Advent and especially at Christmas. When you go to confession these next few weeks to prepare your soul to receive Christ, check with someone who's been away from the sacrament to see if they'd like to go with you. When you have Christmas dinner and Christmas parties, say a blessing over the food. Wish people "Merry Christmas", not the bland "Happy Holidays." Send religious Christmas cards, not secular Santa-and-Rudolf cards. Most especially, though, make sure you're praying every day and staying close to Christ yourself. It's impossible to bring others to our Lord if you're not with Him regularly yourself. Through the example and intercession of St. Andrew, may we lead others to Jesus this Advent season, and rejoice with them at the birth of our Savior.
