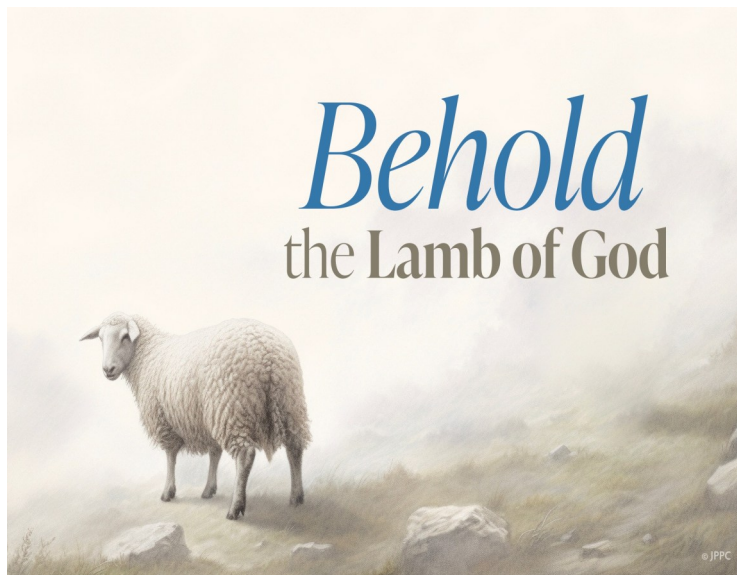

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time—the Time During the Year—includes the numbered Sundays between Christmas Time and Lent and between Pentecost Sunday and Advent in the Liturgical Year. While there is not a focus on a particular aspect of the Mystery of Christ, there is a complete presentation of Christ and all his great works, as well as the call to be his faithful followers as members of the Church. This Sunday, we are invited by Saint John the Baptist to recognize Jesus as the Lamb of God. Jesus is the One sent to us to save us from our sins as our Savior and Redeemer. As we begin this period of Ordinary Time, let us respond to the word of God with a renewed commitment to follow more sincerely the Lord and all he teaches us. Our participation in the Sunday Eucharist with the worthy reception of Holy Communion at the Supper of the Lamb fortifies us for this commitment.

Today we begin the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, January 18 through January 25. We join with Christians all throughout the World to pray that all who belong to Christ in Baptism may come to a deeper unity with one another in the Church. Please remember this intention in your personal prayers.

This Monday, January 19, 2026, is the observance of the Martin Luther King Jr. National Holiday. This holiday has come to have a twofold focus. On the one hand, we recall the legacy of Martin Luther King Jr. as a champion of civil rights. On the other hand, we see the need to give expression to the equal dignity of each person by deeds of service that we can freely render to one another. In our own lives, let us keep the holiday with some reflection on our own Christian mandate to respect one another regardless of race and our duty to be ready to help our neighbors in their need.

This Thursday, January 22, 2026, is the anniversary of the 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion in the United States. Since then, millions of unborn children have lost their lives as a result of legalized abortion. This scar on the face of our nation continues to call Christians, everyone, into action in the defense of human life, from the first moment of conception until natural death. Respect for life is not the work of a few but the duty of all. The one thing that all of us can do is pray for the protection of human life.

Since 2011, Catholics in the United States, at the direction of the American Bishops, have observed January 22 as a day of prayer and penance. The intention of our prayer is for the full restoration and legal guarantee of the right to life. Our penance is for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. Decide today that you will pray for this intention, especially this Thursday and what your personal sacrifice will be. Consider coming to the 7:15 AM or the 12:05 PM Mass in the Cathedral Chapel as part of your prayer for the day. The Holy Rosary will be prayed following both Masses for the intention of the protection of human life.

Thank you again to all our parishioners and visitors for your on-going generosity to the Cathedral Parish, especially at this time of the year. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the Little Sisters of the Poor and their care for the elderly poor. 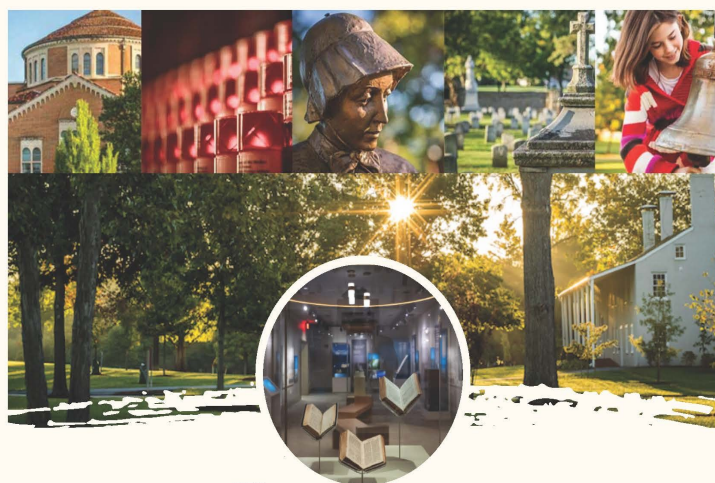

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el segundo domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. El Tiempo Ordinario —el tiempo durante el año— incluye los domingos numerados entre el Tiempo de Navidad y la Cuaresma, y entre el Domingo de Pentecostés y el Adviento en el Año Litúrgico. Si bien no se centra en un aspecto particular del Misterio de Cristo, se presenta a Cristo en su totalidad y todas sus grandes obras, así como el llamado a ser sus fieles seguidores como miembros de la Iglesia. Este domingo, San Juan Bautista nos invita a reconocer a Jesús como el Cordero de Dios. Jesús es Aquel que fue enviado para salvarnos de nuestros pecados como nuestro Salvador y Redentor. Al comenzar este período del Tiempo Ordinario, respondamos a la palabra de Dios con un compromiso renovado para seguir con mayor sinceridad al Señor y todo lo que nos enseña. Nuestra participación en la Eucaristía dominical, con la digna recepción de la Sagrada Comunión en la Cena del Cordero, nos fortalece para este compromiso.

Hoy comenzamos la Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos, del 18 al 25 de enero. Nos unimos a los cristianos de todo el mundo para orar para que todos los que pertenecen a Cristo por el Bautismo alcancen una unidad más profunda entre sí en la Iglesia. Por favor, recuerden esta intención en sus oraciones personales.

Este lunes 19 de enero del 2026 se conmemora el Día Nacional de Martin Luther King Jr. Esta festividad ha adquirido un doble significado. Por un lado, recordamos el legado de Martin Luther King Jr. como defensor de los derechos civiles. Por otro lado, vemos la necesidad de expresar la igual dignidad de cada persona mediante actos de servicio que podemos brindar libremente a los demás. En nuestras propias vidas, celebremos este día reflexionando sobre nuestro mandato cristiano de respetarnos mutuamente sin importar la raza y nuestro deber de estar dispuestos a ayudar al prójimo en sus necesidades.

Este jueves 22 de enero del 2026 se conmemora el aniversario de la decisión de la Corte Suprema del 1973 en el caso Roe contra Wade, que legalizó el aborto en Estados Unidos. Desde entonces, millones de niños no nacidos han perdido la vida como resultado del aborto legalizado. Esta herida en el rostro de nuestra nación sigue llamando a los cristianos, a todos, a la acción en defensa de la vida humana, desde el primer momento de la concepción hasta la muerte natural. El respeto por la vida no es tarea de unos pocos, sino deber de todos. Lo que todos podemos hacer es orar por la protección de la vida humana.

Desde 2011, los católicos en Estados Unidos, por indicación de los obispos estadounidenses, observan el 22 de enero como día de oración y penitencia. La intención de nuestra oración es la plena restauración y garantía legal del derecho a la vida. Nuestra penitencia es por las violaciones a la dignidad de la persona humana cometidas a través del aborto. Decidan hoy que orarán por esta intención, especialmente este jueves, y qué sacrificio personal harán. Consideren asistir a la Misa de las 7:15 AM o a la de las 12:05 PM en la Capilla de la Catedral como parte de su oración del día. El Santo Rosario se rezará después de ambas Misas con la intención de la protección de la vida humana.

Gracias nuevamente a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su continua generosidad con la Parroquia de la Catedral, especialmente en esta época del año. La segunda colecta del próximo domingo se destinará a las Hermanitas de los Pobres y a su labor de cuidado de los ancianos necesitados.
