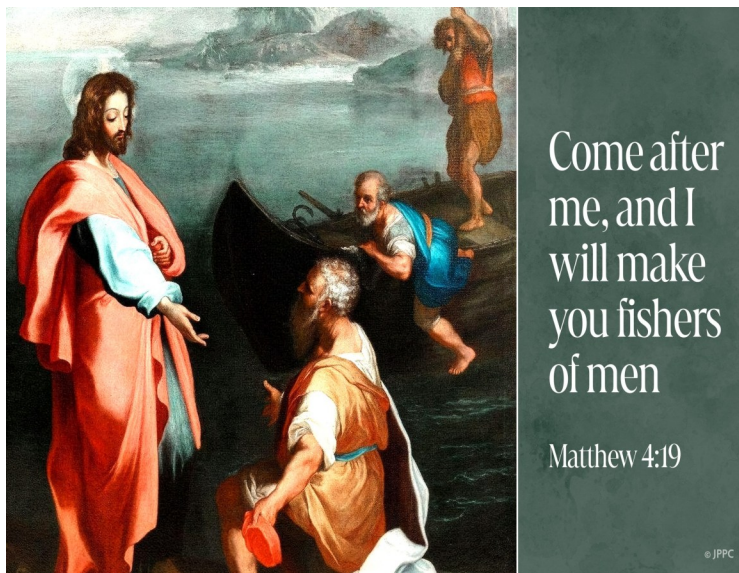

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Jesus calls Simon Peter and his brother Andrew to follow him in the Gospel today. Then after them, he calls two other brothers, James and John, to follow along with Peter and Andrew. What is remarkable about the response of these four men is that they followed Jesus “immediately.” They left everyone and everything to become apostles of the Savior. Jesus calls us daily in multiple ways to follow him. He calls us—as baptized and Communion receiving Christians—to follow him with fidelity to his word and way of life. He calls us as single persons, married persons, consecrated persons, as priests. He calls us constantly to turn to him and away from sin. The immediate response of the Apostles models for us our response to Jesus in all things. This biblical response does not allow us to consider first ourselves or our own needs or anything contrary to Jesus. Let us pray as the Word of God teaches us to be followers of the Lord that we may have the grace—that comes from Jesus—to follow him “immediately.”

The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is now known also as the Sunday of the Word of God. It is true that every Sunday is a Sunday of the Word of God. However, the designation of this Sunday highlights the year-round response of the members of the Church to listen to God as he speaks to us in the Sacred Scriptures, especially during the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. The Word of God forms our hearts and directs our prayer. The Word of God links us with our Jewish brothers and sisters and all Christians as the source of revelation and truth. This Sunday of the Word of God reminds us of the dignity and importance of the proclamation of the holy Word of God. Finally, this Sunday invites all of us to read the Bible with great interest and devotion as part of our daily lives.

This Sunday begins Catholic Schools Week. Many of us know the great value of the Catholic School as part of our own educational experience. This week acknowledges the blessings of a Catholic School education. We honor the administrations, teachers and staffs of our Catholic Schools. We support the families that make the choice for Catholic Schools. The Cathedral Parish is especially grateful to Saint Francis Xavier Catholic School, our partner for the Catholic education of our parish school age children.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity concludes today, January 25, with the liturgical commemoration of the Conversion of Saint Paul. As we have observed this week with prayer for the intention of Jesus that all Christians may be one, let us be mindful of this intention year-round. In addition to our prayer, our good example and clarity of presenting the truths of the Gospel invite Christians to unite in faith and practice.

Next Sunday, February 1, 2026, Archbishop Perez will celebrate the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass for the national observance of the World Day of Consecrated Life.

Thank you again to all our parishioners and visitors for your on-going generosity to the Cathedral Parish.. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the poor and needy in the neighborhood of the Cathedral Parish. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el tercer domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. En el evangelio de hoy, Jesús llama a Simón Pedro y a su hermano Andrés para que lo sigan. Luego, llama a otros dos hermanos, Santiago y Juan, para que sigan a Pedro y Andrés. Lo notable de la respuesta de estos cuatro hombres es que siguieron a Jesús “inmediatamente.” Dejaron a todos y todo para convertirse en apóstoles del Salvador. Jesús nos llama a diario de diversas maneras para que lo sigamos. Nos llama, como cristianos bautizados y que recibimos la Comunión, a seguirlo con fidelidad a su palabra y a su estilo de vida. Nos llama como personas solteras, casadas, consagradas, como sacerdotes. Nos llama constantemente a volvernos a Él y alejarnos del pecado. La respuesta inmediata de los apóstoles nos sirve de modelo para nuestra respuesta a Jesús en todas las cosas. Esta respuesta bíblica no nos permite considerar primero a nosotros mismos, nuestras propias necesidades ni nada que sea contrario a Jesús. Oremos, como nos enseña la Palabra de Dios, para ser seguidores del Señor y que tengamos la gracia —que proviene de Jesús— de seguirlo “inmediatamente.”

El tercer domingo del Tiempo Ordinario se conoce también como el Domingo de la Palabra de Dios. Es cierto que cada domingo es un Domingo de la Palabra de Dios. Sin embargo, la designación de este domingo destaca la respuesta que los miembros de la Iglesia dan durante todo el año al escuchar a Dios cuando nos habla en las Sagradas Escrituras, especialmente durante la celebración de la Sagrada Liturgia. La Palabra de Dios forma nuestros corazones y dirige nuestra oración. La Palabra de Dios nos une con nuestros hermanos y hermanas judíos y con todos los cristianos como fuente de revelación y verdad. Este Domingo de la Palabra de Dios nos recuerda la dignidad e importancia de la proclamación de la Santa Palabra de Dios. Finalmente, este domingo nos invita a todos a leer la Biblia con gran interés y devoción como parte de nuestra vida diaria.

Este domingo comienza la Semana de las Escuelas Católicas. Muchos de nosotros conocemos el gran valor de la escuela católica como parte de nuestra propia experiencia educativa. Esta semana reconoce las bendiciones de una educación en una escuela católica. Honramos a la administración, los maestros y el personal de nuestras escuelas católicas. Apoyamos a las familias que eligen las escuelas católicas. La Parroquia de la Catedral está especialmente agradecida con la Escuela Católica San Francisco Javier, nuestra colaboradora en la educación católica de los niños en edad escolar de nuestra parroquia.

La Semana de Oración por la Unidad de los Cristianos concluye hoy, 25 de enero, con la conmemoración litúrgica de la Conversión de San Pablo. Low-Gluten Hosts

For Catholics who have been diagnosed with Celiac Disease, or any similar gluten intolerance, we have the availability of low-gluten altar breads (hosts) that can be prepared for consecration.

These hosts, produced by the Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in Clyde, Missouri, have been tested to contain less than .001% (10ppm) gluten. In this way, they are both approved for use at Holy Mass and are safe for almost all people who have a gluten intolerance. Additionally, both in storage and throughout the celebration of Mass, these hosts are kept separate, for the sake of those who have more extreme sensitivity to gluten.

To request that a low-gluten host be prepared for you, please come to the sacristy before Mass and make this known to the priest and/or sacristan, who will offer further instructions.
