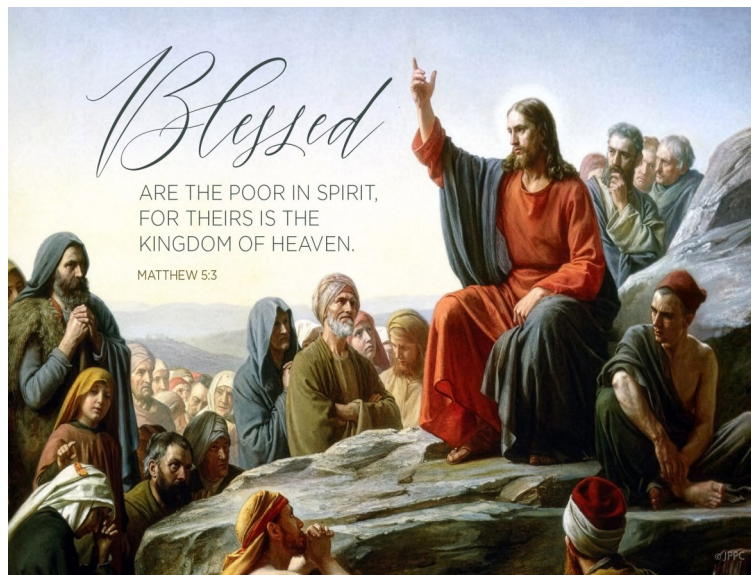

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. These numbered Sundays pass quickly, and they develop for us an incremental understanding of Jesus as our Savior and Redeemer, as well as his constant invitation to be his committed and intentional followers. Today, with the Holy Gospel (see Matthew 5: 1-12a), we join the Lord on the mountain for part of his famous *Sermon on the Mount*. In this part of the sermon, we learn the Beatitudes. We hear the call to live a blessed way—a heavenly way—of life with eyes fixed on serving God and others and not us. This very public way of living the Christian Life can bring personal discomfort and hardship, but the reward is the goal of living the Beatitudes—heaven. Let us support one another in living out the Beatitudes as committed and intentional disciples of the Lord.

In the United States, the World Day for Consecrated Life—for all men and women Religious—is transferred from the universal date of February 2, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, to this Sunday, February 1, 2026. The Sunday observance gives many more people the opportunity to pray together for Religious Priests, Brothers, and Sisters, those now active in the service of the Church, and those who have died. Pope Saint John Paul II established this World Day of Prayer for Religious in 1997 and chose the Feast of the Presentation, the feast that highlights Jesus as the Light of the world, to remind Religious and all of us that those in the Consecrated Life, a life of consecrated chastity, poverty, and obedience, are signs of Christ's Light among us. Today, please keep in your prayers the Religious, living and deceased, who have served the Cathedral Parish throughout the years, as well as the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

This Monday, February 2, 2026, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. A part of this celebration is the blessing of candles used for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. This blessing will take place at the 12:05 PM Mass and the 7:00 PM (in Spanish) Mass in the Cathedral Chapel.

This Wednesday, February 3, 2026, is the Memorial of Saint Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, and the Blessing of Throats. The Blessing of Throats will take place at the 7:15 AM and 12:05 PM Masses on Wednesday, as well as at all the following Sunday Masses, including the Anticipated Mass. You are welcome to ask one of the priests or deacons to bless your throat at any time.

Lent is around the corner! Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2026. For the next two Sundays, February 8 and 15, 2026, there will be a basket near the entrance to the sacristy to collect old blessed palms. Please bring any old palm you may have at home to church on one of these Sundays. The old blessed palm is used for the ashes to be blessed and imposed on Ash Wednesday.

Thank you again to all our parishioners and visitors for your ongoing generosity to the Cathedral Parish. The second collection next Sunday will be directed to the landscape needs of the Cathedral Parish. REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy es el cuarto domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Estos domingos numerados pasan rápidamente y nos permiten comprender gradualmente a Jesús como nuestro Salvador y Redentor, así como su constante invitación a ser sus seguidores comprometidos e intencionados. Hoy, con el santo evangelio (véase Mateo 5:1-12a), acompañamos al Señor en la montaña para escuchar parte de su famoso *Sermón de la Montaña*. En esta parte del sermón, aprendemos las Bienaventuranzas. Escuchamos el llamado a vivir una vida bendecida, una vida celestial, con la mirada puesta en servir a Dios y a los demás, y no a nosotros mismos. Esta forma tan pública de vivir la vida cristiana puede traer consigo incomodidades y dificultades personales, pero la recompensa es el objetivo de vivir las Bienaventuranzas: el cielo. Apoyémonos mutuamente para vivir las Bienaventuranzas como discípulos comprometidos e intencionados del Señor.

En los Estados Unidos, la Jornada Mundial de la Vida Consagrada — para todos los religiosos y religiosas— se traslada de la fecha universal del 2 de febrero, Fiesta de la Presentación del Señor, a este domingo, 1 de febrero del 2026. La celebración dominical brinda a muchas más personas la oportunidad de orar juntas por los sacerdotes, hermanos y hermanas religiosos, tanto los que actualmente sirven a la Iglesia como los que ya han fallecido. El Papa San Juan Pablo II estableció esta Jornada Mundial de Oración por los Religiosos en el 1997 y eligió la Fiesta de la Presentación, la fiesta que destaca a Jesús como la Luz del mundo, para recordar a los religiosos y a todos nosotros que quienes viven la Vida Consagrada, una vida de castidad, pobreza y obediencia consagradas, deben ser signos de la Luz de Cristo entre nosotros. Hoy, por favor, tengan presentes en sus oraciones a los religiosos, vivos y difuntos, que han servido a la Parroquia de la Catedral a lo largo de los años, así como a la Arquidiócesis de Filadelfia.

Este lunes, 2 de febrero del 2026, es la Fiesta de la Presentación del Señor en el Templo. Parte de esta celebración es la bendición de las velas que se utilizan para la celebración de la Sagrada Liturgia. Esta bendición tendrá lugar en la Misa de las 12:05 PM y en la Misa de las 7:00 PM (en español) en la Capilla de la Catedral.

Este miércoles, 3 de febrero del 2026, es la Conmemoración de San Blas, Obispo y Mártir, y la Bendición de las Gargantas. La Bendición de las Gargantas tendrá lugar en las Misas de las 7:15 AM y 12:05 PM del miércoles, así como en todas las Misas del domingo siguiente, incluida la Misa vespertina del sábado. Pueden pedir a cualquiera de los sacerdotes o diáconos que les bendiga la garganta en cualquier momento.

¡La Cuaresma está a la vuelta de la esquina! La Cuaresma comienza con el Miércoles de Ceniza, 18 de febrero del 2026. Durante los próximos dos domingos, 8 y 15 de febrero del 2026, habrá una cesta cerca de la entrada de la sacristía para recoger las palmas bendecidas del año anterior. Les rogamos que traigan a la iglesia las palmas bendecidas que tengan en casa en uno de estos domingos. Las palmas bendecidas del año anterior se utilizan para las cenizas que se bendecirán e impondrán el Miércoles de Ceniza.

Gracias de nuevo a todos nuestros feligreses y visitantes por su continua generosidad con la Parroquia de la Catedral. La segunda colecta del próximo domingo se destinará a las necesidades de jardinería de la Parroquia de la Catedral. 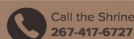
