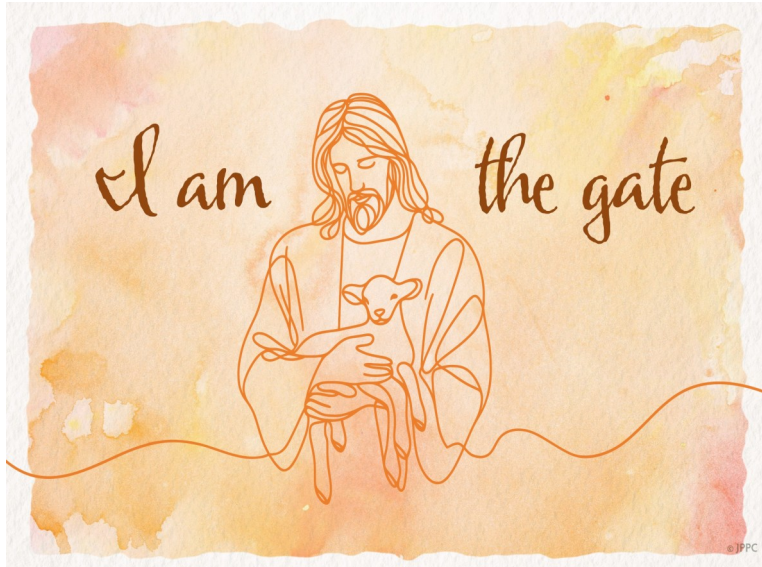

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Easter! This Sunday is also referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday because the Gospel each year for this Sunday is about Jesus, the Good Shepherd of us all. The figure of the Good Shepherd speaks to us of the Risen Lord. When Jesus rose from the dead on Easter morning, he did not rise alone. Rather, he rose from the dead with all of us. He came from the tomb as the Risen Head of his Body, all who have been purchased by his death on the cross for redemption and salvation. He is the Head of his Body, the Church. As the Head, he tends to every member of his Body as a shepherd for his sheep. He is our Good Shepherd, our Risen Lord, guiding and leading us in this life to eternal life.

This is the Collect for Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Easter. Please add it to your prayers today.

Almighty ever-living God,
lead us to a share in the joys of heaven,
so that the humble flock may reach
where the brave Shepherd has gone before.
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Good Shepherd Sunday is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations to the holy priesthood and the consecrated life. The Church is always in need of more numerous vocations to the priesthood and the consecrated life to continue the work of the Good Shepherd—in so many ways—among us. Let us pray for a greater abundance of vocations to the priesthood and the consecrated life all throughout the Archdiocese. Good Shepherd, hear our prayers!

The month of May begins on Friday, May 1, 2026, and is traditionally a month to express special devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. I encourage you to take some time during the days of May to make our traditional Marian prayers a part of your daily prayers—the Regina Coeli, the Angelus, the Memorare, and most of all, the Hail Mary. If possible, pray the Holy Rosary. Sometimes we can only manage a decade, and this is fine at times. I also encourage you to honor Mary in your home with a statue or picture of our Blessed Mother prominently displayed. With such a statue or picture in sight, we are more inclined to turn to Mary in prayer. Reading the biblical stories of our Blessed Mother awakens us to her role in her Son's life and our salvation. We will have our parish May Crowning following the 11:00 AM Solemn Mass next Sunday, May 3, 2026.

The next several weeks are very important for the success of our Parish Keys and Sword Event 2026. We depend on the success of the Keys and Sword Event to supplement many significant needs of the Cathedral Basilica. Estimados feligreses,

¡Hoy es el cuarto domingo de Pascua! A este domingo también se le conoce como el Domingo del Buen Pastor, ya que el Evangelio de cada año para esta fecha trata sobre Jesús, el Buen Pastor de todos nosotros. La figura del Buen Pastor nos habla del Señor Resucitado. Cuando Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos en la mañana de Pascua, no resucitó solo; por el contrario, resucitó de entre los muertos con todos nosotros. Salió del sepulcro como la Cabeza Resucitada de su Cuerpo: todos aquellos que han sido adquiridos mediante su muerte en la cruz para la redención y la salvación. Él es la Cabeza de su Cuerpo, la Iglesia. Como Cabeza, cuida de cada miembro de su Cuerpo tal como un pastor cuida de sus ovejas. Él es nuestro Buen Pastor, nuestro Señor Resucitado, que nos guía y nos conduce en esta vida hacia la vida eterna.

Esta es la Oración Colecta de la Misa para el cuarto domingo de Pascua. Por favor, inclúyanla hoy en sus oraciones.

Dios todopoderoso y eterno,
te pedimos que nos lleves a gozar de las alegrías celestiales,
para que tu rebaño, a pesar de su fragilidad,
Llegue también a donde lo procedió su glorioso Pastor
Él, que vive y reina contigo en la unidad del Espíritu Santo,
y es Dios por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.

El Domingo del Buen Pastor es la Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Vocaciones al santo sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada. La Iglesia necesita siempre un mayor número de vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada para continuar la obra del Buen Pastor, de tantas maneras, entre nosotros. Oremos por una mayor abundancia de vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada en toda la Arquidiócesis. ¡Buen Pastor, escucha nuestras oraciones!

El mes de mayo comienza el viernes 1 de mayo del 2026 y es, tradicionalmente, un mes dedicado a expresar una devoción especial a la Santísima Virgen María. Los animo a dedicar un tiempo durante los días de mayo para incorporar nuestras tradicionales oraciones marianas a sus oraciones diarias: el *Regina Coeli*, el *Angelus*, el *Acordaos* y, sobre todo, el *Avemaría*. Si les es posible, recen el Santo Rosario. A veces solo logramos rezar un misterio (una década), y esto es aceptable en ocasiones. También los animo a honrar a María en sus hogares colocando en un lugar destacado una estatua o una imagen de nuestra Santísima Madre. Al tener a la vista una estatua o una imagen de este tipo, nos sentimos más inclinados a recurrir a María en oración. La lectura de los relatos bíblicos sobre nuestra Santísima Madre nos hace tomar conciencia de su papel en la vida de su Hijo y en nuestra salvación. *La Coronación de Mayo de nuestra parroquia se llevará a cabo el próximo domingo, 3 de mayo del 2026, inmediatamente después de la Misa Solemne de las 11:00 AM.*

Las próximas semanas son cruciales para el éxito de nuestro evento parroquial Llaves y Espada 2026 «Keys and Sword por su nombre en inglés». Dependemos del éxito de este evento para cubrir muchas de las necesidades más importantes de la Catedral Basílica.
