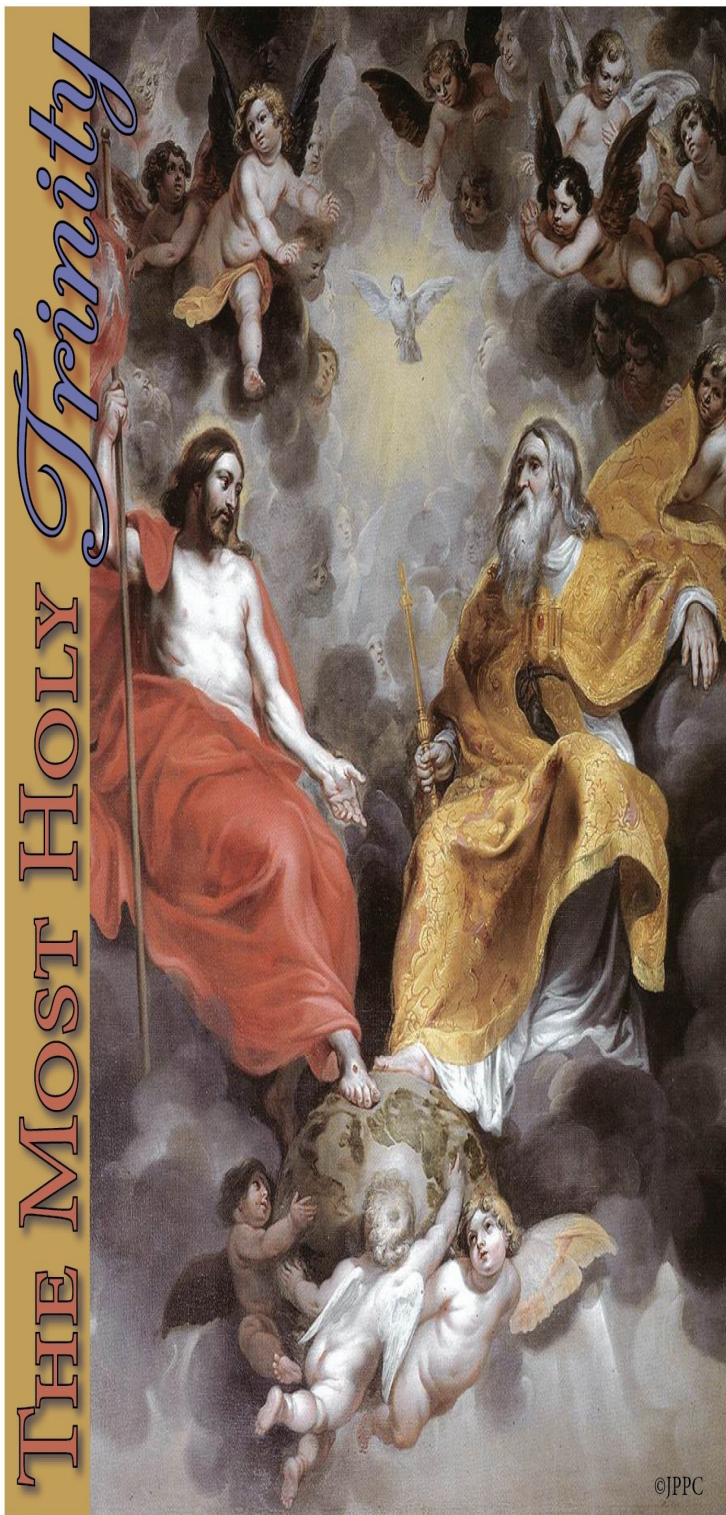

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Of the many thoughts that we may have about this liturgical observance, one stands out among them. The Holy Trinity, three equal divine persons in one God, is a communion of persons. The Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit are united with each other in inexplicable love. This communion of love, with the death and resurrection of Jesus, now includes each of us. Christ unites us with himself in his Paschal Mystery. We are united truly with him to the Father and the Holy Spirit. Every time we celebrate the Paschal Mystery, especially with the Eucharist, we are renewed in our communion with the Most Holy Trinity. This communion animates our Christian life to be about the love of God and neighbor in every possible way.

June is the Month of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This June our US Bishops will consecrate the nation to the Sacred Heart on June 11. To participate in the consecration, you are encouraged to make the Novena to the Most Sacred Heart and to enthrone an image of the Sacred Heart in your home. The Novena begins this Wednesday, June 3. June is the month for Baccalaureate Masses at the Cathedral Basilica. Several of our Archdiocesan High Schools and some of our private Catholic High Schools come to the Cathedral Basilica for the celebration of Mass for graduating seniors. These are festive occasions for students, faculties and families of each of the High Schools. Let us keep our graduates in our prayers during these days as they mark this milestone in their young lives. Let us ask the Lord to keep them faithful to him and bless them as they take their next steps into their futures.

This past Easter Time, thirty some adults received the Sacraments of Christian Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist—in our parish. A very important dimension of their preparation is being accompanied by a parish sponsor. As we look forward to assisting adults for next Easter, we need additional sponsors. If you are interested in this ministry or would like more information about it, please call the Parish Office.

As many of you know by now, the recent clergy changes announced by Archbishop Perez on May 16, 2026, have affected our Cathedral Parish. Father Matthew Carroll, OP, has been assigned as the Parochial Vicar at the Dominican Parish of Saint Pius V in Providence, RI. He will remain with us until Labor Day weekend. Father August Taglianetti, presently the campus minister at Cardinal O’Hara High School in Springfield, PA, has been assigned as our new Parochial Vicar and will begin his service at the Cathedral Parish on July 1, 2026. Additionally, Father Philip Bochanski, currently the Vicar General and Moderator of the Curia with residence at the Cathedral Rectory, has been named the Pastor of Saint Christopher Parish in Philadelphia effective June 15, 2026. Father Eric Banecker, currently the Pastor of Saint Mary Magdalen Parish in Media, PA, succeeds Father Bochanski and will reside at the Cathedral Rectory beginning July 1, 2026. I ask your prayers for these priests and all our priests moving to new assignments at this time.

Además, el Padre Philip Bochanski, actualmente Vicario General y Moderador de la Curia con residencia en la Rectoría de la Catedral, ha sido nombrado Párroco de la Parroquia de San Christopher en Filadelfia, con efecto a partir del 15 de junio del 2026. El Padre Eric Banecker, actualmente Párroco de la Parroquia de Santa María Magdalena en Media, PA, sucede al Padre Bochanski y residirá en la Rectoría de la Catedral a partir del 1 de julio del 2026. 

The Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul is looking for **40-50 volunteers** who would like to serve as Procession Marshalls during the Eucharistic Procession from the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul to the National Shrine of St. John Neumann on Sunday, July 5.

Schedule for the Eucharistic Procession

- 11:00 AM - Solemn Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul
- 12:30 PM - Procession begins in front of the Cathedral, process two miles
- 1:30 PM - Arrival at the National Shrine of St. John Neumann with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament followed by a social

Marshall responsibilities include:

Walking the entirety of the 2-mile Procession route from the Cathedral Basilica to the Shrine of St. John Neumann
Being alert for needs from pilgrims such as water, directions, assistance for medical attention, etc.

Carrying a small backpack with water/essentials for needs of pilgrims
Attending a short pre-Procession orientation at a designated time and place prior to the start of the Procession

Any other needs as they arise before, during, and after the Procession


