Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This Solemnity is more popularly known by the Latin title, *Corpus Christi*. This liturgical commemoration recalls the faith of the Church manifested with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. On Holy Thursday, our Savior gave us the great Sacrament of his Holy Body and Blood, the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist. This Sacrament takes place with the Eucharistic Prayer at every Mass. As the priest takes the bread and chalice with wine into his hands and prays the very words of Christ over them, we have the memorial of the Passion of the Redeemer. We enter into the Sacrifice of Christ as it is actually occurring in our time. This Sacrifice of our Savior gives to us his holy Body and Blood. When we receive Holy Communion, we eat and drink the very death and resurrection of Christ we are celebrating. Please take some time today to reflect on the great gift of Jesus to his Church, to each of us, in the Holy Eucharist. Let us pray that our faith in this wonderful Mystery will increase and our Christian lives will be more deeply rooted in this same Mystery.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us to enter always into the celebration of Mass as a divine event. Christ dies for us and rises for us. As Christ carries out this divine work from his place at the right hand of the Father in heaven for all eternity, so we—through the power of the Holy Spirit—encounter this same event here on earth with every Mass. This is why we must be alert to all the parts of the Mass and participate with Christian joy in this actual work of Christ. We are reminded today to be mindful in action and prayer of the Real Presence of Christ in the reserved hosts in the tabernacle. We genuflect in adoration before we enter our pew and when we leave our pew. We enter the Communion procession for the reception of Holy Communion if we have fasted from food and drink for at least one hour, are free from serious sin and believe with the Church that the bread and wine is truly the glorified Lord, his Real Body and Blood. Our manner of reception of Holy Communion—our bow beforehand, our consuming the host—is a public declaration of our corporate and interior love for this wonderful Sacrament.

This Friday, June 12, 2026, is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. In fact, June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion recalls for us the immediate and constant love of Jesus for each of us. If possible, plan to come to Mass on Friday at 7:15 AM or 12:05 PM in the Cathedral Chapel.

REFLEXIÓN DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados feligreses,

Hoy celebramos la Solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Esta Solemnidad es conocida más popularmente por su título en latín: “*Corpus Christi.*” Esta conmemoración litúrgica evoca la fe de la Iglesia, manifestada en la Misa vespertina de la Cena del Señor del Jueves Santo. En el Jueves Santo, nuestro Salvador nos entregó el gran Sacramento de su Santo Cuerpo y Sangre: el Sacramento de la Sangrada Eucaristía. Este Sacramento se realiza mediante la Plegaria Eucarística en cada Misa. Cuando el sacerdote toma en sus manos el pan y el cáliz con vino, y pronuncia sobre ellos las mismas palabras de Cristo, se hace presente ante nosotros el memorial de la Pasión del Redentor. Entramos así en el Sacrificio de Cristo, tal como este acontece realmente en nuestro propio tiempo. Este Sacrificio de nuestro Salvador nos entrega su santo Cuerpo y Sangre. Al recibir la Sagrada Comunión, comemos y bebemos la misma muerte y resurrección de Cristo que estamos celebrando. Les invito a dedicar hoy un tiempo a reflexionar sobre el inmenso don que Jesús ha hecho a su Iglesia, y a cada uno de nosotros, en la Sagrada Eucaristía. Oremos para que nuestra fe en este maravilloso misterio crezca, y para que nuestra vida cristiana se arraigue cada vez más profundamente en este mismo misterio.

La Solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo nos recuerda que debemos acercarnos siempre a la celebración de la Misa como a un acontecimiento divino. Cristo muere por nosotros y resucita por nosotros. Del mismo modo que Cristo lleva a cabo esta obra divina desde su lugar a la derecha del Padre en el Cielo, por toda la eternidad, así también nosotros, por la fuerza del Espíritu Santo, nos encontramos con este mismo acontecimiento aquí en la tierra, en cada celebración de la Misa. Por esta razón, debemos permanecer atentos a todas las partes de la Misa y participar con gozo cristiano en esta obra real de Cristo. Hoy se nos recuerda que debemos tener presente, tanto en nuestras acciones como en nuestra oración, la Presencia Real de Cristo en las hostias reservadas en el sagrario. Hacemos una genuflexión en adoración antes de ocupar nuestro asiento en el banco y al retirarnos de él. Nos unimos a la procesión de la Comunión para recibir el Cuerpo de Cristo si hemos guardado el ayuno de alimentos y bebidas durante al menos una hora, si estamos libres de pecado grave y si creemos, en unión con la Iglesia, que el pan y el vino son verdaderamente el Señor glorificado: su Cuerpo y su Sangre reales. Nuestra manera de recibir la Sagrada Comunión, nuestra inclinación previa, el acto de consumir la hostia, constituye una declaración pública de nuestro amor comunitario e interior por este maravilloso Sacramento.

Este viernes, 12 de junio del 2026, celebramos la Solemnidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. De hecho, el mes de junio es el mes del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Esta devoción nos recuerda el amor inmediato y constante de Jesús por cada uno de nosotros. Si les es posible, hagan planes para asistir a Misa este viernes a las 7:15 AM o a las 12:05 PM en la Capilla de la Catedral.
